TECHNICAL RULES

1. COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.1 The Cycling competitions of the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games (Konya 2021) will be conducted in accordance with the last version of the International Cycling Union (UCI) Rules and Regulations. In case of any controversy over the interpretation of rules, for Road Cycling, the French version and for Track Cycling, the English version of the UCI rules will be considered binding. Issues not covered by the regulations will be dealt with as below.

1.2 For technical issues, the decisions of the appointed Technical Delegates are binding.

1.3 For general issues, ISG Basic Regulations, General Rules and this Technical Handbook should be consulted.

2. COMPETITION MANAGEMENT

2.1 1 (one) Race Director and 1 (one) Course Director will be appointed.

2.2 In Road Cycling and Track Cycling competitions, international referees will be appointed by the International Cycling Union (UCI) in the number specified below;

2.2.1 1 (one) Race Commissioner, 3 (three) Commissaires, 2 (two) Motorized Commissaires

2.3 In Road Cycling and Track Cycling competitions, a total of 20 national referees will be appointed by the Turkish Cycling Federation.

3. LOCATION AND COMPETITION SCHEDULE

3.1 The Cycling competitions will be held in Konya between 05-14 August 2022 in the currently scheduled period. The Road Cycling events of the Cycling competitions will be held on various routes in Konya and the Track Cycling events will be held at the Konya Velodrome.

3.2 The training venues will be prepared for the participating teams according to a program organized by the Organizing Committee and distributed prior to participation.

4. TECHNICAL MEETING

4.1 Both the Time Trial and Road Race and also Track Races Technical Meetings will be held one day before the competition in accordance with the UCI Regulations in the presence of the Chairman of the Commissaries Panel, the Technical Delegate, the ITOs, KONYA 2021 Competition Director, the Course Director and the Anti-Doping officials. All team managers are required to attend. Start lists will be published at the Technical Meeting.

4.1.1 Confirmation of Starters for Track Races, Time Trials and Road Races

All athletes who will start for Track Races, Time Trial and Road Races will be approved at the Technical Meeting and their licenses will be checked.

4.1.2 Distribution of Cyclists' Numbers and Transponders

All cyclists' numbers and transponders will be distributed at the end of the Technical Meeting.

5. COMPETITIONS AND PARTICIPATION

5.1 A total of 200 cyclists can start in the road race. In order to be able to participate in the competitions, cyclists must have a 2022 approved UCI license from their countries' Federations and must declare the license whenever requested.

In case the number of the cyclists is high, quota will be given according to the country ranking of the UCI (International Cycling Union).

5.2 During the competitions, 3 ambulances will not leave the venue until the end of the event.

5.3 Chief Commissaires will be appointed by the International Cycling Union. In addition to these, 20 commissaires will be assigned from our country.

6. COMPETITION FORMAT

6.1 Road Cycling Competition Rules

6.1.1 Maximum 200 riders will be allowed to start in the Road Race.



6.1.2 Technical Service: TISGOC will provide impartial assistance support for the road races using three vehicles and one motorcycle. Teams can provide technical assistance and change the wheels and cycles provided for this purpose.

6.1.3 Feed Zone: Cyclists are allowed to get food only at specific locations around the course and at times determined by the UCI.

6.1.4 Vehicle Tracking: Team managers will be allowed to provide technical assistance from their team vehicles in accordance with the following regulations:

Each NOC is allowed to have one vehicle in the convoy, in the following order:

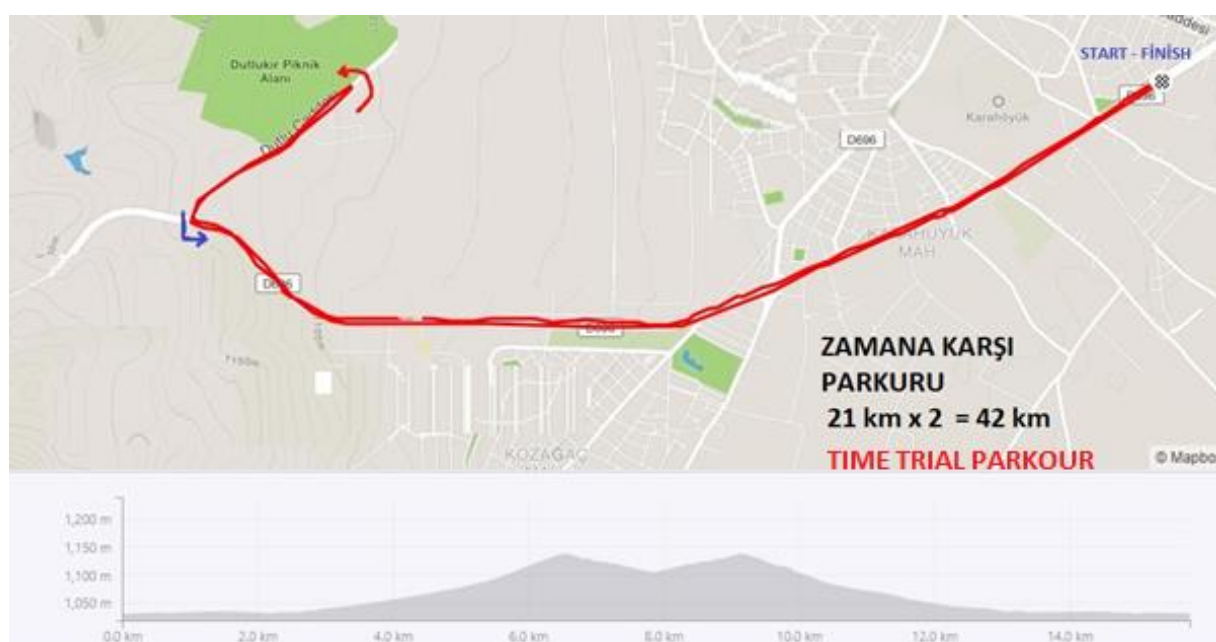
- * The vehicles of NOCs with four or more cyclists in their team;
- * The vehicles of NOCs with fewer than four cyclists are arranged according to the descending number of cyclists. The grouping of NOCs will be communicated by the UCI after the cyclists' conformation;
- * A maximum of 25 National Team vehicles will be in the race convoy.

6.1.4.1 In each group, the ranking is determined by the most recently published UCI Women Elite and UCI Men Elite country rankings. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed country on the ranking is taken into account.

6.1.5 Time Limits: Any cyclist who has been caught and lapped by the leading cyclists or who is over 15 minutes behind the leading cyclists may be eliminated by the commissaires and must leave the race before the course entrance or when crossing the finish line. All other cyclists are included in the race classification according to their finishing position.

6.2 Time Trial Race Rules

6.2.1 Each country will be allowed to participate with a maximum of 2 cyclists for Time Trial.



6.2.2 Start Order: The cyclists start at the same intervals; the cyclists' start order is determined by the UCI and announced after the approval of the starters.

6.2.3 Equipment Check: Cyclists must attend the equipment check at least 15 minutes before their start time. All cycles will be checked using a measuring device that complies with the UCI Regulations. Once checked, cycles will not be allowed to leave the start area.

6.2.4 Technical Service: TISGOC will provide impartial assistance for the road races using three vehicles and one motorcycle. Teams can provide technical assistance and change wheels and cycles provided for this purpose.

6.2.5 Vehicle Tracking: Each NOCs will be allowed to follow their cyclists in a team vehicle and provide technical assistance if necessary. Only the vehicles provided to NOCs by TISGOC will be allowed to track cyclists.

NOTE 1 : Road Cycling competitions (Road Race and Time Trial) will be held as in final competitions format.

6.3 Track Cycling Competition Rules

*Track Races will be held in Konya Velodrome.

NOTE 2 : Track Cycling competitions will be held as in ranking, grouping, elimination and final competitions format in accordance with the UCI Track Cycling Regulations.

8. EQUIPMENT

8.1 Before the starts of the Time Trial races of the Road Cycling competitions, the cycles which will be used by the cyclists during the race will be checked by the responsible referees in accordance with the UCI rules. The place and the time of the cycles' checks will be announced at the Technical Meeting.

9. CLOTHING

9.1 Competitors will wear the official Apparel of their teams in accordance with the UCI rules. No form of advertising or publicity is permitted on sportswear.

10. MEDALS, CERTIFICATES AND AWARD CEREMONY

10.1 Award ceremonies will be held directly following the end of each competition final. The winners will wear their training suits or the official Apparel of their National Olympic Committees.

10.2 Winners in cycling competitions will be awarded the following prizes and certificates:

- The first place : a gold medal and certificate
- The second place : a silver medal and certificate
- The third place : a bronze medal and certificate
- Cyclists placed between the fourth and eighth places will be awarded certificates.
