## C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors), and only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games.





#### C.1. AGE REQUIREMENTS:

<u>Singles</u>: To be eligible to participate in the Lausanne 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2003 and 31 December 2005.

<u>Pairs/Ice Dance</u>: To be eligible to participate in the Lausanne 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games, all male athletes must be born between 1 January 2001 and 31 December 2004 and all female athletes must be born between 1 January 2003 and 31 December 2005.

### HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country has the right to enter one (1) man singles skater, one (1) woman singles skater, one (1) pairs and 1 ice dance couple. Should the Host Country not qualify through D. Qualification Pathway in a specific event(s), then they will be allocated the last qualification place of the respective event(s). The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the Host Country while respecting the eligibility criteria as detailed in C. Athlete Eligibility.

## **E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

ISU shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through D.1, D.2 and D.3 by 1 April 2019. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks until 15 April 2019 to confirm to ISU and Lausanne 2020 Sport Entries if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in G. Qualification Timeline.





ISU shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through D.4, D.5 and D.6 by 30 October 2019. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks until 14 November 2019 to confirm to ISU and Lausanne 2020 Sport Entries if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in G. Qualification Timeline.

## F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

Any allocated quota places that are returned/not confirmed by the respective NOC will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, not yet qualified, in the respective event from the 2019/2020 ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating stand-by list.

The stand-by list will be published in an ISU Communication not later than 30 October 2019 after the completion of the ISU Junior Grand Prix series.

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

If the Host Country qualifies through D. Qualification Pathway or if it declines any of its quota places, then the quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC according to F. Reallocation of unused quota places.
