To be eligible to participate in the Lausanne 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2002 and 31 December 2005.

<b>D.2:</b> Men: 16 Women: 16	D.2.1 The allocation of quota places in D.2 is based on the WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking List.
(8 Mixed Teams)	D.2.2 The remaining eight (8) Mixed Team quota places will be allocated to NOCs not yet qualified according to D.1 based on the WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists. The allocation of quota places will be done by alternating between the WCF Junior Women's Ranking and WCF Junior Men's Ranking List.
	<ul> <li>D.2.3 Allocation of quota places will be done as follows:</li> <li>The first (1st) quota place will be allocated to the best ranked NOC not yet qualified in D.1 on the WCF Women's World Junior ranking;</li> <li>The second (2nd) quota place will be allocated to the best ranked NOC not yet qualified in D.1 on the WCF Men's World Junior ranking and not already allocated a quota place from the WCF Women's World Junior ranking;</li> <li>This allocation process will continue until eight (8) Mixed Team quota places are filled.</li> </ul>

#### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

The Host Country is entitled to one (1) team for the Mixed Team competition composed of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes.

# E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

Following each qualification event, the WCF will publish the results on its website (www.worldcurling.org).

WCF will publish the YOG ranking list referred in D.1.1 and WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists referred to in D.2.1 by 16 March 2019 and inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places. The NOCs will then have fourteen (14) days / two (2) weeks to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **G. Qualification Timeline.** 

#### F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

Any allocated quota place declined or not confirmed by the respective NOC will be reallocated as follows:

- If the NOC qualified through D.1., the quota place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified of the same qualifying zone based on YOG Ranking List;
- If the NOC qualified through D.2., the quota place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified based on the WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists continuing the alternation sequence according to D.2.3.

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACE

The unused Host Country Place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified based on the WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists continuing the alternation sequence according to D.2.3.
